PRESIDENT

The end of another season has arrived, which means it is time to reflect on the Club achievements over the past 12 months. The Club was lucky to have an absolute superstar Management Committee and supporting Officers that accomplished so much more than I could have imagined. You'd be hard pressed to find a harder working group of volunteers that have committed more time and effort to a cause and worked in such unison to give the Club a truly noteworthy season by all measures. Whether it be membership, awards, lifesaving, financials, engagement, grants, media exposure or competition - this season Swanny has exceeded all expectations.

We've tried to capture as much of the Club's progress as possible in the following portfolio reports. As someone reading this report, it's likely you've contributed to the Club in some way, big or small, so thank you very much from the Management Committee and I for making Swanny the best Club on the coast year after year.

Up front, we need to address the pandemic in the room - COVID-19. The Club, as with every organisation around the world has been impacted by the global pandemic. From early March we saw a host of events that our Members had been looking forward to and training so hard for cancelled, including our second Bronze Medallion course, Nipper Club Champs, Junior and Senior end of season celebrations and the SLS Australian Championships. The pandemic brought a somewhat soft close on an otherwise extremely successful and engaged season - I hope that these events haven't tainted the year that was for our volunteers and look forward to seeing as many Members as possible return for season 2020-2021.

COVID-19 AT THE CLUB

You may notice that this issue of the Annual Report omits the details of the Club's most coveted acknowledgments including Patrol of the Year, Patrol Member of the Year, the Education Award, Patrons Award, Kelly O'Mara Trophy, Simon Davies Best Club Person and Life Membership Recipients. It is the hope of the Management Committee that these significant achievements can be announced and celebrated with Club Members closer to the start of next season and we intend to re-issue the 2019-2020 Annual Report with additional detail once this is completed.

In the early stages of the pandemic there was a lot of information being released about the virus but not a lot of guidance specific to surf sports and our operations. We knew that COVID-19 would affect every facet of our operations and wanted to make sure we did our absolute best for the health and wellbeing of our Members and the community so steps were taken to establish a COVID-19 Advisory Sub-Committee in early March.

The COVID-19 Advisory Sub-Committee comprises Club medical professionals Jen White, James Anderson and Leesa Equid and the Management Committee couldn't be happier with the quality and speed in which advice has been provided. Their recommendations were disseminated to the Club via regular membership emails and the creation of a comprehensive COVID-19 Response Plan. Ultimately the Club has been applauded for our COVID-19 response, with Leesa Equid, our COVID-19 Advisory Sub-Committee Chair being asked onto 'Surf Studio', an SLSA web series, to talk about the Club and our actions.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Swanny launched straight into Season 2019-2020 with Part 2 of the Club's adjourned AGM to finalise the proposed Constitution changes as required by the Associations Incorporation Act 2015. These changes needed to be completed and submitted to the regulatory authority by the end of June 2019 for the Club to retain its Incorporated Club status - I'm glad to say we met the deadline. Unfortunately the Club did run out of time to review the By-Laws which have been deferred to this season's AGM - hopefully we will complete the onerous task of updating the Club's rules for the foreseeable future!

PATRONS

Anticipating that as the Club grows and seeks additional funding sources we would require support, I worked to secure a number of strategic Patrons and Vice Patrons for the Club including all three of our very supportive City of Nedlands (CoN) Coastal Ward Councillors and the Mayor Max Hipkins. Max has been a long-time Patron and supporter of the Club over his 8 year tenure as CoN Mayor and I would like to thank him for his years of support.

Cilla de Lacy replaced Max as CoN Mayor and Club Patron in October 2019. Cilla was already a friend of Swanny having contributed to the Club's building extension community consultation earlier in the season. We look forward to working with Cilla in the coming seasons.

In the search for Club Vice Patrons I was lucky enough to get to know both Celia Hammond, the Federal Member for Curtin and David Honey, the State Member for Cottesloe. Their time and contributions over the season have been very much appreciated, from letters of support for the Club's building extension, social media reach and presenting awards at the Cott to Swanny Ocean Classic and SVN Sunset Run Series respectively.

STRATEGIC PLAN 2020-2025

This season was the last to be covered by the Club's previous Strategic Plan, I'm happy to report that with the exception of the building extension and a few other areas that are no longer considered priorities, the Club met or exceeded nearly all of the strategic goals. This is a huge achievement, contributed to by a decade of strong Club Management Committees and Officers.

The new overhauled Strategic Plan which will carry us through the next 5 years of the Club's development has recently been completed. James Anderson lead the Strategic Plan Sub-Committee with significant input from the Management Committee, Sydney Hodges, Lucy Gunzburg and I. Robust community consultation informed the initial direction of the new Strategic Plan, this came in the form of a Club wide survey and later, a consultation period to review and comment on the draft document. The final output is designed to be easily digested and something that inspires engagement from all Club Members. It is aspirational but achievable and looks to direct Swanny toward new goals and continued success into the future.

BUILDING EXTENSION

You may have heard about the Club's proposed building extension in previous seasons, but this season I hope you took one of the many opportunities offered to be directly involved with the project. I personally spent hundreds of hours progressing this very necessary project, and had varying levels of support from many Club members. I'd like to thank all Club Members who made the effort to fill in building extension surveys, attend the community consultation day or provide input at the Open Day stall. I'd also like to specifically call out the following people who made significant contributions to the project this season:

- Building Extension Sub-Committee bringing a diverse set of skills together, the Sub-Committee comprising Jon Broomhall, Erinn Litchfield, Daniel Juengling and Vaughan Brazier, met regularly and worked hard to progress the project.
- Daniel Juengling Dan has been championing this project since his days as Club President and he
 continues to volunteer so much of his professional skill set and time to the design and development of
 the future building extension.
- Sydney Hodges and Jason Williams for their substantial contributions to the project from a strategic perspective. Nobody likes to be stuck with the paperwork, but Syd and Jas supported me and created content for much of the documentation that was produced for the grant applications including the Business Case, Feasibility Statement, Needs Analysis, Asset Management Plan and Lifecycle Cost Analysis.
- The Management Committee who have spent many hours at Committee Meetings understanding, discussing and supporting this project, attended community consultations and Lucy Gunzburg specifically who often joined me to meet with Councillors, State and Federal Members, grant providers and reporters.
- Tim Tucak for your inputs, attendance at Council meetings and City of Nedlands community workshops.

As evident by the cast of many listed above who contributed substantially to the building extension project - we made massive headway this season, and came so very close to making the building extension a reality and breaking ground as planned in March 2021. However, this was not to be... Just days before a \$370K grant from Lotterywest was due to receive Board approval and the City of Nedlands was to vote on matching this sum, Lotterywest withdrew all grants and applications (even ours which was more than 6 months through negotiations) to divert funding to COVID-19 efforts. This was a huge blow for the team (and me personally), but we can end this season knowing that absolutely every effort was made and it took nothing less than a global pandemic to stop us. A brief list of the progress achieved towards the Club's building extension this season includes:

- A neighbour, Allen Park and stakeholder door knocking campaign
- Community consultation
- Club consultation including development plan boards and presentation
- Business Case documents and presentation
- Meetings with all City of Nedlands Councillors, Mayor and Community Officers
- Meetings with and instigation of letters of support from Celia Hammond, Federal Member for Curtin and David Honey, State Member for Cottesloe
- Working with SLSWA including Mark Irwin and James O'Toole
- Development of 3D presentation models
- Architectural drawings and costings
- Comprehensive Feasibility Study
- Life Cycle Cost Analysis and Asset Management Plans
- Grants
- Application for Community Sports and Recreation Facility Funds Grant, including Grant Officer meetings and hundreds of pages of application and supporting documents
- Motion to City of Nedlands for capital grant contribution
- Application to Lotterywest for Community Grant funding including 6 months of consultation with Lotterywest and the Grant Officer
- Application for Federal Driving Social Inclusion Grant funding
- Continued fundraising and saving measures across the Club
- Planning Development Application

MEMBER APPRECIATION

I couldn't let this Annual Report go by without specifically thanking a few Club Members that have really supported me this season:

- Jason Williams From the very start of the season Jason dived in to help with building extension calculations and technical documents. Jason then proceeded to join the Stronger Communities Sub-Committee and lead the much needed patrol tower renovation, spending many hours on the tools (often solo) to deliver an outstanding result.
- Sydney Hodges Sydney has put her formidable strategic skills to use in so many aspects of the Club this season. From day one working on the building extension grant documents, to Stronger Communities and many other grant opportunities, Bronze Medallion administration and the Club's overhauled Strategic Plan. Thankfully we didn't have to pay for her consultation time, with the hours Sydney contributed we wouldn't be able to afford the bill.
- Peran Bishop I couldn't fit a summary of his contributions in full sentences, so here's an abridged list to show how much he's helped me (and the Club) this season: Club AV, beginner boards, IT support, Club alarm upgrade, new security cameras, WI-FI upgrade, Bronze Medallion everything, Bar Manager, graphic design work, Country Carnival party, Blue Party and Ocean Classic AV.
- Tim Tucak For his guidance on all things Swanny throughout the season, especially historical and constitutional issues. Tim initiated the most recent round of Constitution corrections and has provided welcome advice and feedback on the larger changes proposed by the Management Committee.
- Lucy Gunzburg, Deputy President Lucy brought her wealth of committee experience to a new role this season and supported me hugely in the process. From overseeing the Surf Sports, Junior Development and Education portfolios to chairing the By-Laws Sub-Committee and joining me for newspaper photo opportunities. Importantly, Lucy provides a sometimes contrasting voice to mine on Committee, making sure there is balanced and well considered debate.
- Mark Grzanka, Finance & Administration Most positions of Office at the Club are as big as the Office Bearer wants them to be, the same cannot be said for Finance and Administration. It is by necessity the biggest and most important job at the Club, and Mark makes light work of it. His countless hours and dedication mean the rest of the Management Committee can get on with their roles, knowing that the day-to-day operations of the Club are in great hands.
- Kate Hutchinson, Club Captain Kate has been an asset on the Executive Committee this season as well as supporting the Social, Marketing and Lifesaving portfolios. Kate's efforts produced one of the most successful Club Open Days in recent memories as well as perhaps the most inclusive Country Carnival ever, with a great group of Nippers and Youth Members joining the always rowdy Seniors.
- Management Committee The most stellar bunch of portfolio Managers the Club could ask for, supreme thanks to Erin Gallagher, Dave Parson, Logan Ovenden-Clarke, Justin Owens, Max Davies & Annie Juengling. I could go on for days about their achievements this season, but I'll just let you read their reports.







Strategic Plan 2020-2025







The hundreds and hundreds of hours that Luke has dedicated to the running of Swanny Surf Club in this past year is simply mind blowing. Whilst we all know Luke is pivotal in our Club organisation, he is forever humble about what he personally accomplishes so many would not know the true extent of what he has managed (except maybe for his lovely wife Emma). Luke began the season in the role of Club President with clear objectives and high expectations of the team around him. His passion, patience and professionalism have all contributed to Luke demonstrating the highest level of leadership and it has continued to earn him the respect of so many. Thank you Luke! It has been simply inspirational!

One of the first of many significant achievements seen at Swanny this season was the opening of the Gallery of Greats. The Club launched The Gallery of Greats in August, with patrons and dignitaries present, to recognise those Club members, past and present, whose achievements not only are judged to be distinguished and exceptional in the Club's history, but also demonstrate a standard of excellence widely accepted within the surf lifesaving community. It was great to see the size of patrols consistently in double digits with everyone being extremely proactive in getting cover and accepting substitutions. So, a massive thank you to our 231 patrolling members, including our amazing Nipper patrols helping with the next generation of Swanny legends every Sunday, for making this such an awesome season. Because of your efforts we had:

- 0 drownings;
- 4 rescues:
- 56 first aid cases; and
- 443 preventative actions

As usual, the Swanny shorebreak claimed its annual collection of shoulders and noses, the nudies did not disappoint with their weird and wonderful calls for assistance, and the stingers came out in force with some form of new hybrid devil spawn!

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Leesa Equid for laying the ground work in the role in the initial months of the season, before SLSWA decided she couldn't be the State Medical Officer and Swanny Lifesaving Manager at the same time. Also, Emma Dunning for all your hard work in the role over the previous seasons and always being available to answer my questions. Both of your support throughout the season made picking up the role that much easier.

LIFESAVING HIGHLIGHTS

Pushing the season back two weeks worked well and would have given our second lot of Bronze participants plenty of patrolling experience on some very busy days had things gone according to plan. The new patrol times have been a great success too, finishing that little bit early seems like you have so much more of the day left to chase waves and laze at Daisies!

- The start of the season saw the introduction of "patrol training themes" to try to increase our skills development throughout the season. It was great to see this embraced by all patrols, with the opportunity to get real time feedback on the effectiveness of CPR using the "fancy Annies" particularly well received.
- Thanks to the fantastic effort of our first 4 Drone Operators to gain SLSWA qualifications (Jack Rigby, Naomi Kohan, Alex Harrison and Adrian Defrancesco), Swanny now has its very own Drone Patrol. The intention of the drone is to provide additional observation for marine threats at peak times such as Nippers look out for more opportunities to join the Drone Patrol next season.
- The City of Nedlands Council provided us with new portable "No Dogs" signs to help make it easier for us to keep the beach enjoyable for all users.
- Patrol Tower Upgrades What can I say, Jason Williams needs a special mention for all his hard work
 planning and implementing some fantastic changes that will make tower time much more comfortable
 (as well as safer), especially when the Doctor comes in. How much nicer is the new ladder on the feet!
- SwimRun Water Safety Once again a massive effort from the 40 odd members who helped out for over eight hours on the day. Special mention to Ben Juengling for his outstanding organisation leading up to the event and coordination on the day which included a medical evacuation via RFDS.
- Swanny was the last club providing volunteer lifesaving patrols in WA this season, and one of the last in the country (excluding those funny northern QLD clubs with their overly aggressive stingers in summer). The dedication and professionalism of our Members has been noted by both SLSWA and SLSA, we may be a small club, but we punch above our weight.

These challenges are a great way to incorporate key lifesaving skills such as fitness, rescues and teamwork into a training activity during quiet times on patrol and I look forward to seeing many more next season.

LIFESAVING CHALLENGES

- SLSWA's decision to suspend the use of methoxyflurane (the green whistle) until legislation was updated proved challenging for one or two of our first aid patients but luckily the ambulance response time was very quick.
- The SLSA Patrol App Fantastic when it works, absolutely frustrating when it doesn't. We made the decision early on to go back to paper, hopefully the issues with the app will be sorted by next season.
- Don't get me started on Jetskis... It seems every season at least one Jetski insists on getting beached past nudies. This season it was five Jetskis at once just after Christmas! After one of their group of riders injured himself trying to jump a wave close to shore, the other riders got beached attempting to help as their craft became waterlogged in the heavy surf. With their Jetskis rolling in the waves, threatening to create a hazard as they drifted north, and the owners refusing to abandon them, the patrol was forced to intervene to prevent a serious incident. The poor ATV was pushed to its limits dragging the Jetskis above the water line up a very step bank. Luckily, no one was seriously hurt other than the rider's pride, and their bank balances, given some of the damage their craft sustained in the surf.
- COVID-19, what can I say? A completely unexpected situation and Swanny smashed it out of the park. It was fantastic to see everyone's mature and understanding response to the rapidly changing situation. In particular, I want to say a huge thank you to those Members who were able to keep patrolling, ensuring we kept the beach safe in what turned out to be one of the busiest periods of the entire season! On Easter Saturday we had over 250 members of the public on the beach, safely patrolled by only two members!

MARKETING

Season 2019-2020 was one of growth for the Marketing portfolio.

Through the Marketing team's significant efforts we ensured our Members were well informed and well dressed, the public were kept up-to-date on our activities and successes, and we contributed over \$100K in revenue to the Club's coffers. The team spent countless hours, many behind the scenes to contribute to such a successful, if abruptly ended, Swanny season.

Joining our longest serving sponsor, The City of Nedlands, it was great to see Class 1 Orthodontics and The Shorehouse join as Club sponsors. Please ensure you continue to support our sponsors whenever the opportunity presents, I know many of you took advantage of the discounted NCFY coffee. Many of you also took advantage of the free skin checks offered by Mole Patrol at the Club during the season. Feedback from Mole Patrol was that we are clearly the healthiest and most fun Club on the coast.

Through the efforts of Claire Sands and Sydney Hodges we targeted and applied for several grants throughout the year and were successful in securing approximately \$15K in funding. With many grants still in progress at the time of print, I am sure we will add to this tally.

We were successful in the Building Stronger Communities Grant and the funds received went towards urgent and necessary upgrades to the patrol tower. Jason Williams led his merry men Sam Rix and Luke Bishop in installing new aluminium and glass balustrading, replacing rusted out steel supports, and priming and painting all structural steel components (thank you Dulux for the paint donation). No longer do you also have to take your life into your hands when heading to complete surveillance in the patrol tower thanks to our new, safe access ladder.

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

MEMBERSHIP

What a massive season for Swanny and what a strange way for it to end with the world in isolation. This year we didn't just break our previous membership record of 542 Members set in Season 2013-2014, we obliterated the record by reaching an incredible 702 Members (703 if you count our resident seal).


The most pleasing aspect of our record membership is that we have strengthened all areas of our membership base. Our Nippers reached record levels, we had an expanded core of Youth Members patrolling and competing and our Senior membership expanded thanks to the largest number of Bronzies ever seen in a season. Even our registered Veteran numbers were up and when the average age of a Swanny Vet is 84 years old, that is impressive!

In other not so exciting membership related achievements this season, we did a lot of work on our SLSA membership database particularly our Working With Children (WWC) requirements and it was very pleasing to see Swanny achieve full compliance amongst its active membership.

FINANCE

Financially, Season 2019-2020 was our best performance in a decade and without delving into Tim's backyard archive bunker I suspect it was up there with our best financial year in history¹. Club expenditure was consistent with previous seasons at \$215K but where Swanny excelled was revenue, which was up 25% to \$357K, an increase of \$72K over last year.

The major growth in revenue can be attributed to the items listed below but ultimately it was due to the hard work of many Members. Simply paying your membership fees, attending Swanny events and supporting the Rampant Swan (always responsibly...) all helped contribute to our strong financial position so a big thank you to the entire membership base.

- Quiz Night The resurrected Quiz Night got the season off to a great start. The night was a sell out and the generosity of the local business community (you don't say no to Emma Doyle) and our Members helped us raise \$15K. A big thank you to Emma Doyle and Lucy Gunzburg for the huge amount of work you did organising the night, engaging with local businesses and running the event.
- Sponsorship and Grants The Marketing Portfolio did a mountain of work pursuing sponsorship opportunities and submitting countless grant applications. As a consequence of their efforts our grant and sponsorship income increased \$30K for the season.
- Membership Growth The massive growth in membership generated a further \$20K in membership fees, with the huge number of Bronze Medallion participants a significant contributor. A big thank you to the Education Portfolio and particularly Peran Bishop for the countless hours you contributed to making the Bronze Medallion courses such a success.
- Donations The long anticipated Gallery of Greats was unveiled this season thanks to Erin Gallagher working like a maniac to deliver in weeks a project that has been on the agenda for many seasons. To assist with funding the project, the call was put out to Life Members for donations and the generous support of many Life Members and other Members throughout the season resulted in over \$10K of donations this season.
- Rottnest SwimRun After a brief hiatus SwimRun was back and Swanny again provided the water safety which delivered over \$10K to the Club. A big thank you to Ben Juengling for securing this event for Swanny and delivering such a high quality service with the help of so many Swanny legends.

If you want to cut through the dark art of financial reporting and get a simple understanding of how Swanny is positioned financially, you just need to take a look at our bank balance. This season our savings have grown by \$121K and now sit at \$490K. It took us the first eight years of the decade to increase our savings by \$200K and we have banked another \$200K in just the past two seasons.

Club maintenance costs have historically been a hindrance to our bank balance which makes this season's result particularly pleasing. In 2019-2020 we incurred \$35K of irregular costs for upgrades to the patrol tower, security and internet systems and the establishment of the Gallery of Greats and yet we still delivered record savings.

Swanny is now in a position to contribute the estimated proportion of funds needed by the Club for the building extension works. Whilst it is disappointing the COVID-19 outbreak has caused other funding delays, the work undertaken by our President Luke Bishop and the Building Sub-Committee has placed us in a very good position to secure funding when the world returns to some sort of normalcy.

MEMBER APPRECIATION

I specifically mentioned Luke's contribution to the building extension project because I want to acknowledge just how much time and effort Luke has actually contributed to Swanny this season. What most of our Members see would be the tip of the iceberg and Luke's volume of work beneath the surface is enormous. From his first day as President taking charge of the Constitution update, Luke has not stopped delivering for Swanny to the highest of standards. If only we could clone Luke but make a younger, more athletic (questionable) and better looking version (also questionable).

On the administration front I would like to acknowledge the following Finance and Administration contributors for keeping the wheels turning on the Swanny juggernaut this season:

Jacqui Ross (Club Administrator) - In Jacqui's second Swanny season she has continued to provide invaluable support to myself, the Management Committee and our Members. Jacqui always does her best to juggle and meet the needs of each portfolio and anyone who has met Jacqui will know she is a great fit for our Club.

- Debra Lyon (Club Secretary, Jun 2019 Nov 2019) Another year and another Secretary baby, what can I say... congrats Deb on your latest Swanny Cygnet! It was great to have Deb back involved and we were sad to see her relocate to New Zealand mid-season. Thank you for juggling your family commitments to take on one of the less glamorous roles at the Club.
- Maia Simmonds (Club Secretary, Dec 2019 May 2020) It was a natural progression that Maia, in her capacity as my personal secretary, would also desire the role of Club Secretary. Not known for being a high achiever, Maia has finally found her niche and produced some exceptionally adequate meeting minutes during the second half of the season.
- Kevin White (Buildings Officer) When he's not rescuing kittens from trees Kev is more often than not down at Swanny fixing showers, doors, fences, trailers, you name it and the great thing about Kev is that he just gets in and does it and the rest of us are none the wiser.
- Tim Tucak (Historical Records Officer and Safety Officer) The location of the archives is a closely guarded secret and I don't know how Tim extracts the most random of information from the archives with such ease but the amount of work Tim does for Swanny and has done for decades is invaluable. Please never stop being the Historical Records Officer or die suddenly.
- Emma Chaffey (Environmental Impact Officer) This was our first official foray into the land of sustainability and with a blank canvas, Emma identified simple and effective ways for Swanny to minimise its environmental footprint and ensure environmental factors are considered as part of our decision making processes. A highlight for the season was Swanny's participation in Clean Up Australia Day.
- Julian Gibbings (Membership Officer) It is a measure of the man that Jules has been a Swanny legend since the 1990's (sorry to give away your age there Jules) and yet remains one of our most committed and approachable members.

Note 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This special purpose financial report was prepared for distribution to the members of Swanbourne Nedlands Surf Life Saving Club Inc. to fulfil the financial reporting requirements of the Management Committee under the Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 2015.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this report, as described below are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of Swanbourne Nedlands Life Saving Club Inc. and are, in the opinion of the Management Committee, appropriate to meet the needs of its members.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets, and has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards.

Peppercorn Lease

Swanbourne Nedlands Surf Life Saving Club Inc. is dependent on a lease from the City of Nedlands that has significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the Club to further its objectives. The nature and terms of the lease include:

- a) Lease payments of one peppercorn per annum payable on the Lessor's demand;
- b) For the Term 1 January 2014 to 31 December 2034;
- c) Applicable to Reserve 7804, Lot 403 on Deposited Plan 36773 being the whole of the land comprised within Crown Land Title Volume LR3136 Folio 90 and Lot 404 on Deposited Plan 36773 being the whole of the land comprised within Crown Land Title Volume LR3136 Folio 91 together with all buildings, structures, alterations, additions and improvements on those portions of the Land or erected on those portions of the Land during the Term;
- d) For the purpose of lifesaving activities including the hire of the facilities for groups and individuals providing such hire is subject to the terms of the Lease.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

Accordingly, the audit in relation to fundraising and cash receipts was limited to testing amounts recorded in the books.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

VALE - SYDNEY (SYD) DAVID ROWE

It is with sadness that the Club informs you that Syd Rowe passed away on the morning of 6th May 2020.

Syd joined the Club on 7th December 1945, gaining his Qualifying Certificate (the equivalent of the Surf Rescue Certificate), Surf Life Saving Association of Australia (SLSAA) No. 1158, on 17th March 1946, aged 16 years. Syd gained his Bronze Medallion, SLSAA No. 24076 on 7th December 1946 with the Swanbourne Nedlands SLSC.

Syd's involvement was in education, administration and competition. He gained his Instructors Certificate SLSAA No. 3945 on 11th December 1950 (equivalent of Trainer Officers Certificate) aged 20 years 9 months followed by his Examiners Certificate WA No. 1 on 3rd July 1952 (equivalent of Assessors) aged 22 years 4 months. Syd was Chief Instructor at the Club in the 1953/54 and 1954/55 seasons. Syd held the positons of Hon. Secretary and Registrar in the 1949/50, 1951/52, 1952/53 and 1953/54. He was Proxy Delegate to SLSWA in 1953/54 and Committee Man in 1956/57.

The sand was Syd's strength with Club Championships in Beach Sprint in 1945/46 as a Sub Junior, 1947/48 as a Junior and the 1951/52 Open Beach Sprint Club Champion. In Points Races he won the Beach Sprint in 1945/46 as a Sub Junior and 1952/53 in Open. At the 1950/51 Club Championships he was Club Champion Lifesaver. Syd won the Wegner Trophy in 1945/46 and the Caris Cup Club Marathon in 1946/47 shared with Jim Seabrook. As Patrol Captain in 1952/53 his patrol team won the Allen Shield for Patrol Efficiency (Patrol of the Year): Syd Rowe (Capt), Clarrie Bowyer (Vice Capt), Barry Wegner, Wally Wegner, Ray Nicholson, and Barry Rowe (Syd's brother).

Syd attended the 1951 Australian Jubilee Surf Championships at Scarborough, WA participating in the Beach Sprint, Beach Relay and March Past. Along with Gerry Atherden, Don Ogier, and Reg Trigg, Syd was the reel team for Peter Atherden who was the State Champion in the 1950/51 Junior Belt Race. Syd had a great impact on several Club members in the early and mid-fifties as he was instrumental in building up a well regimented and highly competitive Junior Rescue and Resuscitation (R & R) team.

Outside of surf lifesaving Syd was a good footballer. He played in the Western Australian National Football League (today known as the West Australian Football League or WAFL) for the Claremont Tigers with 2 league games (for 1 goal and 3 points) in the 1951 season.

Syd married Coralie Simmons who was an active Member of the Ladies Surf Club. The Bill Wales Memorial Trophy for Outstanding Achievement in Surf Boat was donated by Coralie and Syd Rowe in honour of Bill Wales. First awarded at the Annual Dinner on Saturday 9th May 1998 in the Club Hall, it is a scale model of a surf boat.

At the 50th Anniversary Dinner held on 13th November 1982, Syd was one of a number of Club Members awarded a Long Service Award badge, for prior service at the Club. Most recently Syd re-joined the Club in 2010/11 and was a Swanny Veterans Member since that time.
