HISTORY

The F. E. Ford Cup was donated by Mr Frederick Edmund Ford of Williams Road in Nedlands.¹ Originally from Victoria Mr Ford was resident in Western Australia at the time of the formation of the Club² and in 1935 was a staff photographer with The West Australian and The Western Mail newspapers.³ Mr Ford served in the Australian Army in World War and was discharged in October 1944.⁴

Mr F. E. Ford is first acknowledged in the 1947/48 Annual Report as a trophy donor for the Ford Trophy. (There is no mention in the 1945/46 Annual Report, nor the Minutes from 1945/46 to 1946/47 and the 1946/47 Annual Report is not available). In the 1948/49 and 49/50 Seasons Mr. F. E. Ford was acknowledged as a Vice Patron of the Club.

The Minutes of the Executive Committee Meeting held at the Clubrooms on 11th February 1948 state:

"Mr R. Claybrook reported that Mr. Ford and Mr Hewitt has approached with reference to holding an inter-Club Carnival at the Nedlands Baths on Tuesday night."

The Minutes of the Executive Committee Meeting held at the Clubrooms on 17th March 1948 state:

"It was reported that Mr. Ford had donated a trophy for the Junior Champion Surfer, this was submitted to the Trophy Committee. A letter of acceptance to be sent to Mr. Ford."

The 1947/48 Annual Report does not list the Junior Champion Surfer as being awarded a particular trophy, but separately lists a Ford Trophy being awarded to A. Rees, a Lady Member.

The connection between the Nedlands Baths, the Ford Trophy being awarded to a woman and reason for Mr Ford joining the Club as an Associate, was his daughter Margaret, a champion swimmer.

Swimming Youthful Champion

To have won the individual women's championship of the Royal Life-saving Society of Australia at the age of 15 is the remarkable achievement of Miss Margaret Ford, of Nedlands.

Not much more than a toddler when she first learnt to swim, Margaret Ford now holds more certificates and trophies than many prominent sports identities accumulate in a lifetime. Although now a backstroke specialist-her latest achievement was to break the under 16 State backstroke for women. Miss Ford is also a strong freestyle exponent and only this year won the title of champion woman surfer and beltwoman of the Swanbourne Surf Club. She broke the under 16 State freestyle record for women when she was only 13. In all she has held five backstroke records.



Miss Margaret Ford

Last year Miss Ford was swimming champion of Perth Girls' School and open senior State school champion. She has now left school and will shortly enter a business college.

Swimming - Another Record Fifth to Margaret Ford.

Swimming faultlessly under ideal conditions in the Claremont baths on Thursday night in the 110 yards women's backstroke, under 15 years State championship heat, Miss Margaret Ford reduced Miss L. Smith's State record of 1 min 41 1-5sec by 5 and 1-5sec.

With five other swimmers Miss Ford qualified for the State final of the event at Claremont this afternoon during the fourth State championship swimming carnival of the WAASA.

She now holds five State record times, as follows: 220 yards women's freestyle (under 16). 3min 1 1-5sec; 55 yards women's backstroke under 13, under 14, under 15 in 44 4-5sec, and last night's effort, the 110 yards women's backstroke under 15, in 1 min 36sec.

Event: Swum over a distance of one mile

HISTORY

With the President's Cup first held on 12 March 1933 over a distance of half a mile and the Kirby Cup first held on 18 March 1934 over a distance of $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, it seems logical that a swim race over a distance of one mile would be considered. The first consideration occurred only a week and half after the inaugural Kirby Cup:

Meeting held at Allen Park March 28, 1934

Moved Mr I Dover seconded Mr R Kemp A mile Marathon Race, to include Obstacles and a swim, be held on Sunday Afternoon April 1st. 1934. Carried.

Moved Mr Ron Claybrook second Mr R Kemp an entry fee of three pence be charged, and a trophy to be bought from the proceeds. Carried.

The result of the mile marathon race is not recorded noting that 1st April 1934 was Easter Sunday. It would be a further three years until a mile swim was reconsidered:

Meeting Held Allen Park 4/1/37

Moved F. Farrant sec R. Claybrook. Letter of thanks to Mr Mercer for donation of Trophy.

Meeting held Allen Park 18/1/37

Executive Meeting

Moved T Colvin sec G Allen that Mercer cup be trophy for a mile swim.

Amendment K Ismail sec H Newby, cup be for a marathon race.

Amendment R Claybrook sec R Kemp. Reserve cup for inter-club carnival subject to approval of donor.

The committee then voted and the motion of T. Colvin for a mile swim won the ballot.

So the Mercer Cup became the initial trophy for a one mile swim. Of the other options considered at the meeting for the Mercer Cup, the marathon/endurance race became the Caris Cup and the cup for the inter-club carnival became the Swanbourne Cup. The dates for the inaugural Mercer Cup and Caris Cup were set at the following meeting:

Meeting held Allen Park 8/2/37

Moved J Allen jun, sec G Allan that endurance race be Feb 14th, Cup for three distances March 20th, and Mile swim March 27.

(The Holbrook Cup was the race for three distances.)

Moved J. Allen senior seconded R. Kemp that Gala Day & cup dates be suspended for the time being & further discussed at next meeting on 8th March.

Meeting held at 8/3/37

A motion moved by J. Allen jnr seconded R. Brennan, that cup races be conducted on 21st and 28th March, was lost to the following amendment:-

Moved as an amendment by R. Claybrook sec R. Kemp that Club championships be held on 20th and 21st March. Put & carried.

Moved R. Claybrook seconded G. Allen that Executive Committee decide re running of cups, etc;

Meeting held Allen Park 22/3/37

Moved R. Cook seconded K. Burnett that Mercer Cup be held on March 28th

Noting that 28th March 1937 was Easter Sunday it appears the event was either not held or the results not reported. The annual Gala Day on 4th April and the Holbrook trophy on 11th April were held as planned.

The donor of Mercer Cup was Alfred Harold (Horrie) Mercer, the owner of Mercer's Newsagency in Claremont Crescent, Swanbourne.

Horrie Mercer was Vice Patron of the Club in 1936/37; 1939/40 and 1940/41. He was also Club President of the Claremont Football Club from 1936 to 1949.

As noted earlier the inaugural Mercer Cup on the 28th March 1937 might not have occurred given it was Easter Sunday or perhaps it was just that the results were not reported. The language used for what would be the second running of the Mercer Cup in 1938 implies that the inaugural event was that in 1937 – note no use of 'inaugural' or 'first' in the report prior to the event and then the use of 'annual' post the event:

SWANBOURNE CLUB. The Swanbourne surf club will conduct the Mercer Cup ocean handicap on Sunday morning commencing at 11 o'clock.

SWANBOURNE CLUB. The Swanbourne Surf Life-Saving Club conducted its annual mile race for the Mercer Cup yesterday morning and practically every member of the club took part.

The West Australian, Monday 28 February 1938, p5

As it turns out the Mercer Cup was relatively short lived after Tom Woodall won it three times in succession and therefore retained the trophy as was the convention at the time for trophies:

Minutes of the Sports Committee February 1st 1933
Presidents' Cup – It was unanimously decided that the President's Cup be swum over a distance of half a mile, and the swimmer winning it three times in succession or four times in all to retain it.
