## **HISTORY**

This trophy is actually three trophies in one, that have been combined/re-inaugurated over time. Originally the Allen Shield for Patrol Efficiency from 1935, it was re-inaugurated as the City of Nedlands Shield in the 1958/59 season. After not being awarded for several seasons it was resurrected in the 1997/98 season as the Patrol of the Year in conjunction with inaugural The Patrol Member of the Year trophy.

There were two new trophies for inauguration in season 1958/59. One was a shield from the Municipality of Nedlands for annual competition and the other was a perpetual trophy donated by Mr C. W. Court M.L.A., (Member of Nedlands, later Sir Charles Court and Premier of Western Australia) who was Patron of the Club.

The Club decided to allocate these to the champion patrol and champion lifesaver competitions. At the December 1958 Committee of Management Meeting it was noted that the Municipality of Nedlands Shield would be allocated to the Inter-Patrol Competition and the C.W. Court Shield (later renamed C.W. Court Trophy) to the Champion Lifesaver Competition.

The donation of the Municipality of Nedlands Shield was undoubtedly connected to the improvements being undertaken at Swanbourne Beach as part of the Beach Development Project. As noted at the 1958 Annual General Meeting, a beach kiosk and public change rooms would be erected and opened in the new year. The Surf Club pavilion would follow, to be complete by the 1959/60 season. These buildings were the Swanny Reef Café, Changerooms and the Club Hall (opened August 1960 and demolished in July 2004).

The other major change was the Nedlands achieved City status on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1960, having exceeded the required population of 20,000. Therefore the trophy was renamed to the City of Nedlands Shield, although the trophy was actually engraved as the City of Nedlands Trophy. Assuming the trophy was of the same physical form then as it is today, then it definitely is a trophy not a shield!

Prior to 1997 the By-Laws provided for a "Champion Patrol Competition (conditions as laid down by the Beach Committee each year)". It was proposed to replace this with the "Best Patrolling member (as decided by the Lifesaving Manager)" during changes to the Constitution when the Club operational structure was updated in the July 1997. Despite being removed from the By-Laws and not having been awarded for several seasons, the trophy was resurrected in the 1998 as the Patrol of the Year in conjunction with inaugural The Patrol Member of the Year trophy.

Subsequently in August 1998 the trophy was reinstated to the By-Laws as the "Best Patrol (as selected by the Lifesaving Manager)".

At many of the recent Annual Dinners, this trophy has been presented by the Patron, the Mayor of Nedlands.

# The City of Nedlands Trophy for the Patrol of the Year

This is a team award which is given to the patrol which gives outstanding service to the Club and the community over the course of a season.

As with the Patrol Member of the Year, this award is judged on several criteria. The patrol should have a good attendance record, and absent members should find substitutes when they cannot make their rostered hours. The patrol should work as a team, and carry out all the duties required; setting up the equipment, setting safe swimming areas, maintaining constant vigilance on the beach, providing water safety for races, and of course, providing first aid or assistance to those who require it. For most seasons it is presented to the patrol that performs these duties with a consistently high standard, but occasionally will be awarded for a single act of bravery, dedication or brilliance, such as an outstanding or difficult rescue. Winners of the award to date have been:
